

Fall Asters



These perky little blue and almost lavender daisy type flowering plants are a great addition in contrast to your yellow and orange mums.

They add a simple delicate flair to any landscape. Asters like to be planted in full sun (to partial shade) and like a soft loamy soil.

After a few years of growth, they may need to be divided to provide ample growth to the massive roots they may acquire. Please feed them in the spring when the new growth appears.

WHAT RETAILERS USUALLY WON'T TELL YOU

Asters are prone to getting a fungus if they are too crowded. Make sure there is enough air circulation to prevent blight and mold.
